Making Technical Presentations

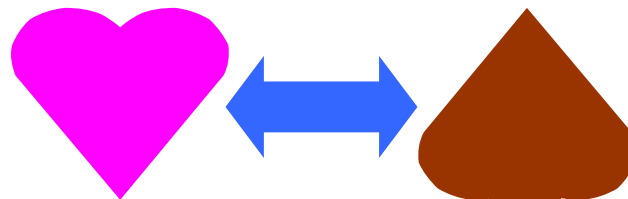
